John A. Blando is an associate professor of counseling and the coordinator for the specialization in gerontological counseling. He teaches courses in the counseling process, couple and family counseling, gerontological counseling and assessment as well as psychological foundations of counseling and counseling aspects of sexuality. Dr. Blando received his Ph.D. and M.A. from Stanford University; his B.A. is from Rockhurst College. His clinical training included work at UCSF's Langley Porter Psychiatric Institute, Stanford University Hospital and the Palo Alto Veterans Affairs Medical Center (Psychiatry Service). Prior to coming to the Department of Counseling, Dr. Blando worked in the social service sector as well as in private practice. His interests include spirituality and counseling, LGBT counseling, gerontological counseling and multicultural counseling. He is the co-editor (with Profs. Lee, Orozco, and Mizelle) of the popular *Introduction to Multicultural Counseling for Helping Professionals, 2nd Ed.*, and is completing *Counseling Older Adults*, to be published by Routledge. Recent articles and book chapters include *Buddhist Psychotherapy with Older LGBT Clients* (Journal of GLBT Family Studies, in press), *Spirituality, Religion and Counseling* (Counseling and Human Development, 2006), and *Openhouse: Community building and research in the LGBT aging population* (with Adelman, Gurevitch, & de Vries, in *LGBT Aging: Research and Clinical Perspectives*, 2006). Dr. Blando is a member of the editorial boards of the *Journal of International Counseling* and the *Journal of Homosexuality*, a regional trainer with the *APA HIV Office for Psychology Education*, and a member of the board of directors of the *California Coalition for Counselor Licensure*.
