Andrés J. Consoli, Ph.D. is a professor in the Department of Counseling, College of Health and Human Services, at San Francisco State University and a visiting professor in the Department of Psychology at the Universidad del Valle de Guatemala. Born and raised in Argentina, Dr. Consoli received a licenciatura degree in clinical psychology at the Universidad de Belgrano, a Masters and doctorate in counseling psychology at the University of California, Santa Barbara, and postdoctoral training in behavioral medicine in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Stanford University. He is the president of the Interamerican Society of Psychology (7/2007-6/2009, www.sipsych.org). His former leadership positions include secretary and then president of the Western Association of Counselor Education and Supervision (4 years), treasurer of the Interamerican Society of Psychology (6 years), and member of the executive board of the National Latina/o Psychological Association (6 years). Dr. Consoli's professional and research interests involve international collaborations, multicultural supervision, psychotherapy integration and training, systematic treatment selection, values in psychotherapy, access and utilization of mental health services within a social justice framework, and the development of a bilingual mental health workforce.
